

PICTURE PERFECT PORTRAIT

Tom Plant **commissioned** his **portrait** from popular portrait artist <u>Alphonse Jongers</u> around 1914. Today a digital reproduction of the original painting hangs above the stairs of Lucknow Mansion, and the original is hung at the retirement home he built in Bath, Maine.

Jongers had his **subject** pose for the painting, the way we do for pictures now. But since paintings take considerably longer to produce than photographs, this required the subject to stay still for a bit of time.

Tom wanted his portrait to show his love of nature, so Jongers made the **background** a representation of the view from Lucknow, and used natural looking colors for the background and Tom's clothing.
