



# A Look at Lucknow:

How History and Technology Intersect

## Vocabulary Words

- Arts & Crafts Movement:** A movement in European and American design during the late 19th and early 20th centuries promoting handcraftsmanship over industrial mass production
- Boudoir:** A woman's dressing room, bedroom, or private sitting room
- Butler:** The chief male servant of a household who has charge of other employees, receives guests, directs the serving of means, and performs various personal services
- Caldera:** A volcanic crater formed by the collapse of the central part of a volcano that has a diameter much bigger than the volcano's vent
- Coal:** A black solid combustible substance formed by the partial decomposition of vegetable matter that is widely used as a natural fuel
- Dumbwaiter:** A small elevator used for carrying food and dishes from one story of a building to another
- Granite:** A very hard natural igneous rock (formed by solidification of magma) with a crystalline texture used especially for building and monuments
- Homestead/Homesteaders/Homesteading:** A lifestyle of self-sufficiency, in which a grant of land would be purchased by a homesteader who then built their home (homestead) on that tract of land

**-Indigenous:** Of or relating to the earliest known inhabitants of a place and especially of a place that was colonized by a now-dominant group (in the USA, Native Americans)

**-Inglenook:** A nook by a large open fireplace, often with a bench

**-Intercom:** A two-way communication system

**-Organ:** A keyboard instrument in which sets of pipes are sounded by compressed air and produce a variety of timbres or tones

**-Pantry:** A room for preparation of foods, which can also be used for storage

**-Ring-dike:** A circular mountain range formed by a volcano imploding due to eruption. The Ossipee Mountain Range is one of only 3 of these geographically unique features

**-Roundel:** Rounded glass pieces used to decorate architecture and interior designs. At Castle in the Clouds, there are 21 different hand-painted ones found throughout Lucknow

**-Suite:** A group of rooms occupied as a unit



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## Connect Four

### **MATERIALS:**

- Digital Connect Four
  - \*After opening the link above, please "make a copy" of the file.\*
- Provided on the Google Slides link is physical playing cards that can be used as a variation to the game. Please cut out before beginning the activity.

### **HOW TO PLAY**

- When correct, the chip can be placed on the board in an attempt to make four in a row. Remember to try and block your opponent so YOU are the first to make a group of four!
- Have students practice skills in a fun and engaging way with this Connect Four game! Students play just like regular Connect Four, except they must correctly define or use the vocabulary words in a sentence before placing their chip on their spot. The first person to have four correct answers in a row wins!

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## Tic-Tac-Toe

### **MATERIALS:**

Tic-Tac-Toe word cards (provided) and game board (provided)

### **HOW TO PLAY**

- To play, students will play regular tic-tac-toe by placing down one of the vocabulary cards onto the spot they claim.
- BUT instead of moving on, they have to spot and define the word.
- If defined correctly, then they can draw their X or their O on top of the card to claim it and that spot.

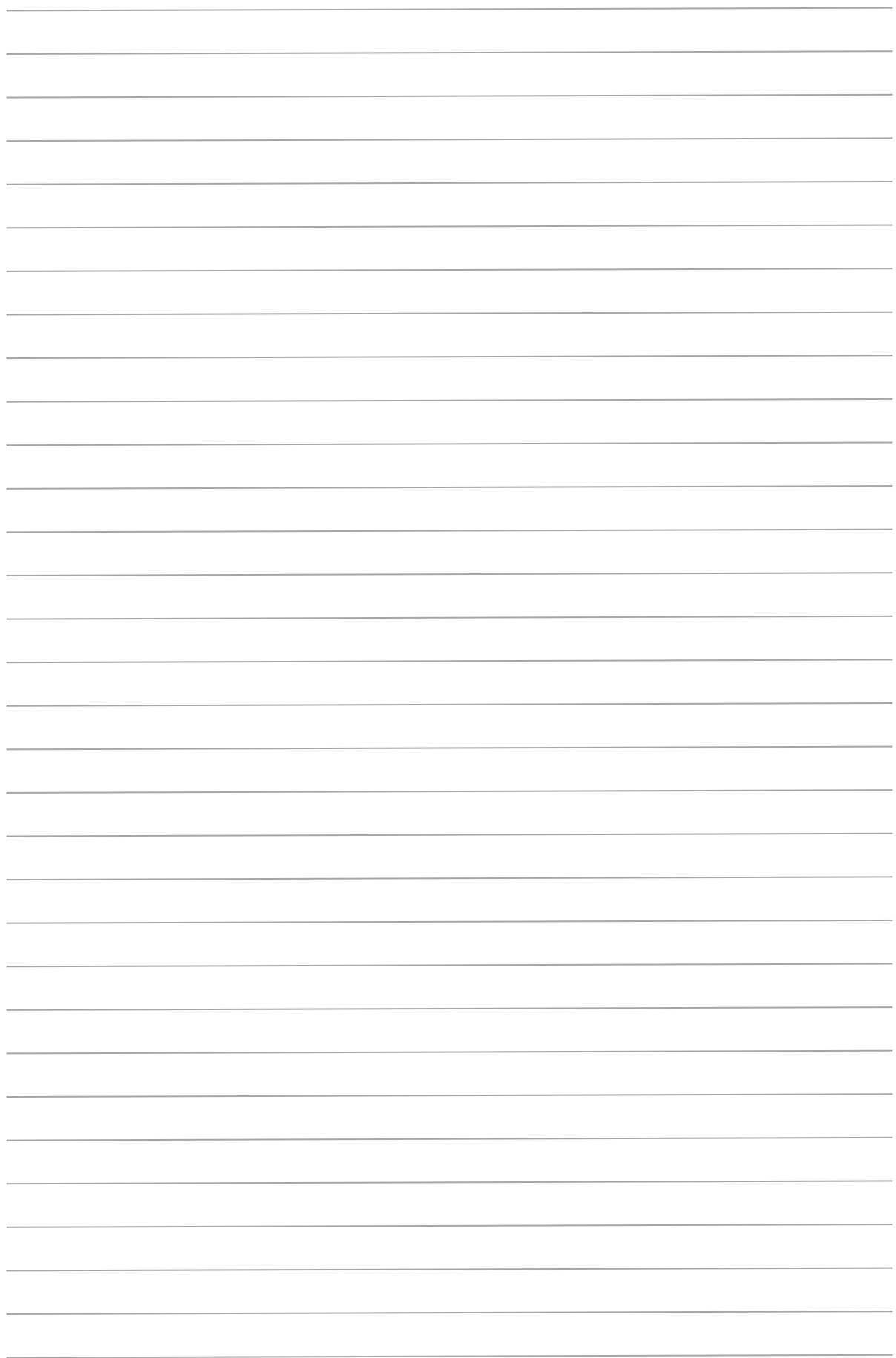

- Vocabulary Words (provided on the first two pages of this file)

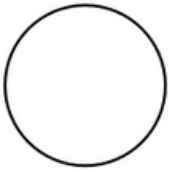
## **DESCRIPTION:**

This is a fun activity that students relate to with the present day involving social media. Using a social media template, students write as if they are posting on their technology devices, just as they do in their everyday lives. Students practice using vocabulary words related to this lesson by selecting a word from the list, drawing a "post" in the box, then creating a "caption" for the "post".
